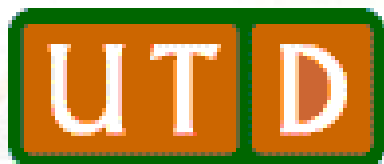

AFROTC Courses

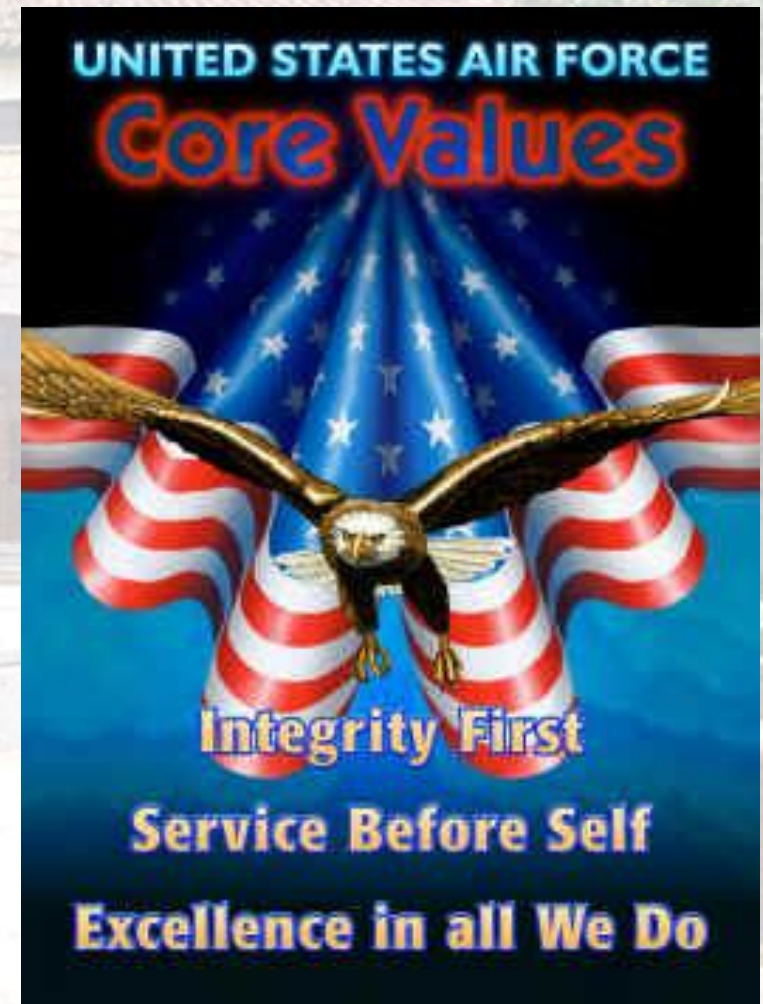
3 Distinct Phases

AFROTC

- **General Military Course (GMC)**
(no commitment unless on scholarship)
 - “Try before you buy”
- **Field Training (FT)**
 - You must compete for a slot to attend FT and enter the POC
- **Professional Officers Course (POC)**





General Military Course (GMC)



Develop America's Airmen Today ... for Tomorrow

- Typically - first two years of college (Freshman or Sophomore)
- Take 1 credit hour class each semester
 - Freshman- Foundation of the Air Force
 - Sophomore- Evolution of Air and Space Power
- Leadership Laboratory
 - Learn to march, customs and courtesies, uniform wear, follower-ship





Field Training



Develop America's Airmen Today ... for Tomorrow

- **Required summer training to test and enhance leadership**
 - Usually occurs between sophomore and junior year
- **Approximately 4 week encampment**
- **Maxwell AFB, AL and Camp Shelby, MS**





Field Training...then what?



Develop America's Airmen Today ... for Tomorrow

- **Decision Time**
- ***Contract* during first week of follow-on semester**
 - **You commit to finish bachelors degree and accept an Air Force commission**
 - **Air Force commits to bring you on active duty for a minimum of four years**





Professional Officer's Course (POC)



Develop America's Airmen Today ... for Tomorrow

- **Typically, final two years of college**
 - Juniors, seniors, and graduate students
- **Take 4 credit hour class each semester**
 - Junior: Leadership & Mgmt Principles
 - Senior: National Security Affairs & preparation for Active Duty
- **Leadership Laboratory**
 - Lead GMC in accomplishing lesson objectives for the week
 - Learn and perfect leadership
 - Practice, practice, practice leadership skills



Approximate Weekly Time Commitment

Develop America's Airmen Today ... for Tomorrow



- **GMC**
 - 1 hour academic class each week
 - 2 hour leadership laboratory each week
 - 2 hour physical fitness each week
 - 1 hour flight time
- **POC**
 - 3 hour academic class each week
 - 2 hour leadership laboratory each week
 - 5+ hour meeting/preparation time for job position
 - 2 hour physical fitness each week



AFROTC Scholarships for HS Seniors

- **High School Scholarship Program (HSSP)**
 - 4 year scholarships
 - Very competitive
 - High School students apply online at WWW.AFROTC.COM
 - Pays tuition/fees
 - Type I - up to uncapped
 - Type II - up to \$18,000
 - Type VII - up to \$9,000 (in-state)
 - Books: **\$900/year**

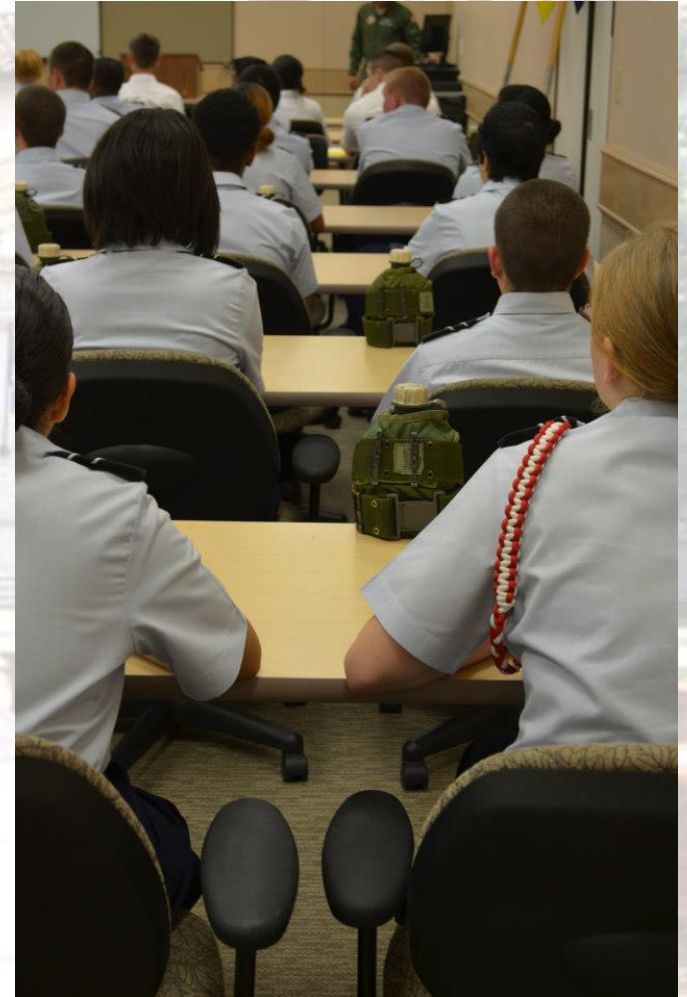

- **In-College Scholarships - Air Force \$\$**
 - 2-3 year scholarships
 - Very competitive
 - Pays tuition/fees
 - Type II - up to \$18,000
 - Type III - up to \$9,000
 - Type VI - up to \$3,000
 - Books: **\$900/year**
 - Stipend
 - Selections are made by nomination to HQ

What's Included?

- **Tax-free Stipend included for those who Contract (scholarship AND non-scholarship students)**
 - *FR: \$300/month*
 - *SO: \$350/month*
 - *JR: \$450/month*
 - *SR: \$500/month*
- **Yearly book allowance (Scholarship only)**
 - *\$900/year*

 - After 20 years – 50% of base pay (high 3)
 - After 30 years – 75% of base pay

 - **Foreign Language Proficiency Pay (FLPP)**
